How?

- 1. Earn all you can.
- 2. Save all you can.
- 3. Give all you can.

TURN AROUND POINT:

Your tendency might be to hoard because it's easier for you to trust what you can put your hands than to trust the One who provides it all. But God challenges you to earn, spend, serve, and give methodically. He wants you to create a margin to give more intentionally.

FIRST STEPS:

Determine what percentage you will live on and what percentage you will give to others.

Start where you are.

Look for opportunities to give even more.
