Sermon in a Sentence:

You can measure your love for your neighbor by what you're willing to sacrifice to see them experience Jesus's love.

Please, allow me to tell you one way our congregation will think and act when Jesus's love shapes us.

When Jesus's love rules in our congregation, we will say, "Serve them first."

We won't ask, "What about us?"

You won't say, "Pastor, serve them first."

We won't wonder, "Who will serve them first?"

When Jesus's love compels our congregation to act, we will say, "We will serve them first. We will serve those outside God's family first. We will serve our neighbors in need first. We will follow Jesus in seeking, serving and saving the lost FIRST. Then, and only then, will we serve each other."
