We have a perception problem. We do not see people from Jesus's point of view.

We put some ideas and behaviors into boxes called sacred, biblical, at church, and God's Day. At the same time, we put other thoughts and actions into boxes we name secular, unbiblical, not at church, and my time.

Then we put them into boxes like believers or unbelievers, good or bad, us or them,
Protestant or Catholic,
Wesleyan or Baptist,
and righteous or sinful.

Once you think your good choices make you good people then you'll look down on those who don't make the same good choices.

The problem with thinking Jesus is like you is that you begin to see everyone not like you as anti-Jesus.

There is, by the way, one surefire way to know if you're more focused on yourself than on others – self- protection.

We have a perception problem that permeates everything from our perspective of who Jesus is, as well as how we look at other people.

What does it look like when the Holy Spirit fills a person until they see others like Jesus sees them?
