I'm starting this study of the book of Acts in the apostle Paul's letter to the Jesus followers in Rome.

Paul is the main character in over half of the book of Acts. That record of the early church ends with Paul under house arrest in Rome. Paul wrote to the Romans to introduce himself to them. It was written sometime before the end of Acts and in the 15th chapter, he gives a very short summary of his work.

Romans 15:14-19 NET

<mail>14</small> But I myself am fully
convinced about you, my brothers and sisters, that you yourselves are
full of goodness, filled with all knowledge, and able to instruct one
another. <small>15</small> But I have
written more boldly to you on some points so as to remind you, because of
the grace given to me by God <small>16</small> to be a minister of Christ Jesus to
the Gentiles. I serve the gospel of God like a priest, so that the
Gentiles may become an acceptable offering, sanctified by the Holy
Spirit. <small>17</small> So I boast in

Christ Jesus about the things that pertain to God. <small>18</small> For I will not dare to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me in order to bring about the obedience of the Gentiles, by word and deed, <small>19</small> in the power of signs and wonders, in the power of the Spirit of God. So from Jerusalem even as far as Illyricum I have fully preached the gospel of Christ. https://bible.com/bible/107/rom.15.14-19.net

There are four ingredients in the Spirit's plan for building the Church - "by word and deed, in the power of signs and wonders, in the power of the Spirit of God."

Sermon in a Sentence: When the Holy Spirit does what only he can do, people draw closer to Jesus.
