What have you lost because of COVID-19?

The afternoon of the first Easter seemed bleak and black to two grieving disciples walking the lonely road away from Jerusalem.

Luke 24:13-14 NIV

<small>13</small> Now that same day two of
them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from
Jerusalem. <small>14</small> They were
talking with each other about everything that had happened.

discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked
along with them; <small>16</small> but
they were kept from recognizing him.

Luke 24:17-24 NIV

<small>17</small> He asked them, $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ What
are you discussing together as you walk along? $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ They stood still, their
faces downcast. <small>18</small> One of
them, named Cleopas, asked him, $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ Are you the only one visiting
Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these
days? $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ <small>19</small> $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ What

things? $\hat{a} \in \Box$ he asked. $\hat{a} \in \triangle$ About Jesus of Nazareth, $\hat{a} \in \Box$ they replied. $\hat{a} \in \triangle$ He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. <small>20</small> The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; <small>21</small> but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. <small>22</small> In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning <small>23</small> but didn $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}$ find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. <small>24</small> Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus. $\hat{a} \in \Box$ https://bible.com/bible/111/luk.24.17-24.NIV

Jesus was not and is not unmoved by human grief and loss. He stood outside the tomb of his dear friend Lazarus and wept. Jesus wept. His body shook with sobs and trembled with gut-wrenching pain.

Luke 24:25-27 NIV

<small>25</small> He said to them, $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! <small>26</small> Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory? $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}$ <small>27</small> And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

Jesus did not chastise them for how they felt BUT he challenged them to believe the promises God made.

Luke 24:28-32 NIV

<small>28</small> As they approached the
village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going
farther. <small>29</small> But they urged
him strongly, $\hat{a} \in x$ with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is
almost over. $\hat{a} \in x$ So he went in to stay with them. <small>30</small> When he was at the table with them, he
took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them.
<small>31</small> Then their eyes were
opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight.
<small>32</small> They asked each other, $\hat{a} \in x$ were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the

Other Ideas for Expressing Your Feelings

- 1. Write letters to Jesus and read them aloud.
- 2. List three things that stimulated your hope at the end of the day (Jesus Sightings List).
- 3. Tell Jesus exactly what you feel out loud. Yell at him. He can take it. (He is the Ultimate Safe Person.)
- 4. Talk to a safe, $\hat{a} \in God$ -with-skin-on $\hat{a} \in God$ -with person who will not try to fix you, offer you bumper sticker answers, or talk about it with others. This might be another person in our church family, or it may be a counselor.
- 5. Practice being a safe, $\hat{a} \in God$ -with-skin-on $\hat{a} \in God$ person who will not try to fix others, offer them bumper sticker answers, or talk about it with others.
