Bay City Wesleyan Church Public Gathering Information Determining and doing what the Holy Spirit wants for us shaped the Church Boardâ $\mathfrak{E}^{\text{TM}}$ s discussions about gathering publicly. That led us to seek a balance between protecting each other and meeting at our building. Our meetings will change, but Jesus wonâ $\mathfrak{E}^{\text{TM}}$ t. He still reigns as King of Heaven and Earth.

What did we decide? [Our plans may change depending on circumstances in our community.]

- $\hat{A}$ . The TENTATIVE date for our first face-to-face gathering is Sunday, June 21, at 10:45 a.m. for Morning Worship only. This will be a bare basics gathering. It will be outdoors weather permitting.
- $\hat{A}\,\cdot\,$  If you are sick or have been exposed to someone who is sick, do not come to the church building. Thank you.
- $\hat{A}$ . We will continue to live stream Sunday Morning Worship on Facebook. Recordings are available both online and on CDs or DVDs. The Wednesday Prayer times and devotionals will still be posted online as well.
- $\hat{\mathsf{A}}\cdot$  Childcare will not be provided at this time. The Nursery will be closed. Children do not understand and will not practice physical distancing.
- $\hat{A}$ . A locked offering box will be provided next to the center doors to the worship area. You can continue to use Tithe.ly or to mail checks as well.
- $\hat{A}$ . Some seats will be taped off. We recommend families sit together.
- $\hat{A}$ : Masks are not mandatory, but Pastor Mark recommends that you wear one. If you can bring your own, please do so. But masks will be available. After use, worshipers may take masks with them or deposit them in a container to be cleaned for reuse.
- $\hat{A}\,\cdot\,$  We will provide hand sanitizer and facial tissues as much as possible. If you can bring your own, please do so.

You must be under authority to be in authority. The exercise of authority is the result of submission to a higher authority.

From this story, we can deduce at least three things.

- 1. Jesus is looking for a quality of faith that is simultaneously humble and bold.
- 2. And he doesn't care where he finds it.
- 3. Jesus is a category crusher and he has little tolerance for our prejudgments about people.

It $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{T}^{M}$ s still true today. Sometimes the most amazing faith comes from the most surprising people; the people we least expect to have faith. The

corollary is also true. Sometimes the most disturbing lack of faith comes from those we most expect to have it.  $\hat{a}\in \mid$  Be on the lookout  $\hat{a}\in \mid$  for  $\hat{a}\in \mathbb{C}$  faith, and don $\hat{a}\in \mathbb{C}$  count anyone out, especially the ones you might consider least likely to even know Jesus.
