Text: John 1:43-51
Title: How Do You Know Me?

Hebrews 9:11-15 NLT

<small>11</small> So Christ has now become the High Priest over all the good things that have come. He has entered that greater, more perfect Tabernacle in heaven, which was not made by human hands and is not part of this created world. <small>12</small> With his own bloodâ€”not the blood of goats and calvesâ€”he entered the Most Holy Place once for all time and secured our redemption forever. <small>13</small> Under the old system, the blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer could cleanse peopleâ€™s bodies from ceremonial impurity. <small>14</small> Just think how much more the blood of Christ will purify our consciences from sinful deeds so that we can worship the living God. For by the power

of the eternal Spirit, Christ offered himself to God as a perfect sacrifice for our sins. 15</small> That is why he is the one who mediates a new covenant between God and people, so that all who are called can receive the eternal inheritance God has promised them. For Christ died to set them free from the penalty of the sins they had committed under that first covenant.

Isaiah 6:1-7 NLT

1</small> It was in the year King Uzziah died that I saw the Lord. He was sitting on a lofty throne, and the train of his robe filled the Temple. 2</small> Attending him were mighty seraphim, each having six wings. With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. 3</small> They were calling out to each other, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Heaven's Armies! The whole earth is filled with his glory!" 4</small> Their voices shook the Temple to its foundations, and the entire building was filled with smoke. 5</small> Then I said, "It's all over! I am doomed, for I am a sinful man. I have filthy lips, and I live among a people with filthy lips. Yet I have seen the King, the Lord of Heaven's Armies." 6</small> Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a burning coal he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. 7</small> He touched my lips with it and said, "See, this coal has touched your lips. Now your guilt is removed, and your sins are forgiven."

43</small> The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me." 44</small> Philip, like Andrew and Peter, was from the town of Bethsaida. 45</small> Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—"Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." 46</small> "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip. 47</small> When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, "Here truly is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit." 48</small> "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked. Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you." 49</small> Then Nathanael declared, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the king of Israel." 50</small> Jesus said, "You believe because I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You will see greater things than that." 51</small> He then added, "Very truly I tell you, you will see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."
